THINKING IN TRANSLATION

Thinking in Translation posits the Hebrew Bible as the fulcrum of the thought of Franz Rosenzweig (1886-1929), presenting him as the author of a unique synthesis between systematic thinking and biblical interpretation. Addressing a lacuna in Rosenzweig scholarship, the book offers a critical evaluation of Rosenzweig's two major works: *The Star of Redemption* and his translation of the Bible together with Martin Buber.

THE SERIES: STUDIA JUDAICA

After World War II, Ernst Ludwig Ehrlich (1921–2007) published works in English and German by eminent Israeli scholars, in this way introducing them to a wider audience in Europe and North America. The series he founded for that purpose, *Studia Judaica*, continues to offer a platform for scholarly studies and editions that cover all eras in the history of the Jewish religion.
